16   **POLICY**

17

18   It is the policy of the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office to provide its personnel with wearing

19   apparel and other related equipment as required for their job assignments. All members of the

20   Sheriff's Office are responsible for conforming with the standards related to the wearing of

21   uniforms and equipment described herein. Personnel shall not wear or carry apparel/equipment

22   not issued by the Sheriff's Office. The Sheriff or his designee may authorize exceptions to

23   apparel/equipment requirements contained in this policy.

25   **PURPOSE**

26

27   To promote professionalism and uniformity in appearance, establish procedures for the issuance,

28   and replacement of uniforms/equipment, and to establish guidelines for the Sheriff's Office

29   personal awards program.

31   **PROCEDURES**

- 32
- 33   • General
  - 34    ○ Employees shall have access to a copy of the rules and regulations and general orders
  - 35    manual through Power DMS.
  - 36    ○ Employees shall be responsible for the proper care and use of department property
  - 37    and equipment assigned to or used by them and shall promptly report to their
  - 38    supervisors any loss, damage, destruction, or defect therein.

- 39           ○ Deputy Sheriffs shall keep their uniforms clean and pressed, their shoes and other  
40           leather equipment polished and shined, and badges and nameplates clean and bright.  
41           Shoes and socks shall be black in color and of an approved type.
- 42           ○ Deputy Sheriffs and/ or employees wearing civilian clothing on duty shall present a  
43           neat and clean appearance.
- 44           ○ Employees shall wear clothing that is appropriate to the type of duties and citizen  
45           contacts that are expected, (e.g., coat and tie for men and equivalent skirt, blouse, or  
46           pants outfit for women that are appropriate for business contacts; more informal  
47           sports clothing may be appropriate for specific instances as approved by the  
48           individual's supervisor.
- 49           ○ Civilian dress should not be a source of negative comment from the community.

- 51           ● Court Attire
- 52           ○ Uniforms or civilian business attire (coat and tie for men or equivalent for women)  
53           shall be worn for all court appearances.

- 55           ● End of Employment Equipment Turn In
- 56           ○ When an employee terminates employment, all issued equipment shall be returned no  
57           later than on the day that the termination is effective.
- 58           ○ Failure to return all items of county property will result taking legal action, civil or  
59           criminal.

181       • Body armor  
182       ○ Body armor shall be issued to all deputies assigned to routine field duty (patrol and  
183       investigative) and to other deputies as available.  
184       ○ Deputies working a patrol function are required to wear body armor while on duty.  
185           ▪ Patrol functions are defined as any assignment where a deputy is providing some  
186       type of patrol or security.  
187  
188       • Clothing Allowance  
189       ○ Investigators receive a monthly clothing maintenance allowance.  
190  
191       • Uniform Regulations  
192       ○ Sheriff's Office uniforms consist of Class A, Class B, Class C and specialized  
193       uniforms.  
194  
195       • Class A uniform  
196       ○ The class "A" uniform may be worn for the following:  
197           ▪ Normal duty.  
198           ▪ Formal functions where a dress uniform is appropriate.  
199  
200       ○ The Class A uniform will consist of the following:  
201           ▪ Dress coat, if issued  
202           ▪ Long sleeve uniform shirt.  
203           ➤ Long sleeve shirt with outer vest carriers are not considered Class A uniform.  
204  
205           ▪ Uniform pants with or without matching stripe.  
206           ➤ BDU style pants are not considered Class A uniform.  
207  
208           ▪ Tie  
209           ▪ Black dress shoes or polished boots.  
210           ▪ Dress hat (Optional)  
211           ▪ Ribbons (optional)  
212  
213       • Class B Uniform  
214       ○ The class B uniform may be worn for the following:  
215           ▪ Normal duty.  
216           ▪ Any Sheriff's Office activity where another class of uniform is not specified.  
217  
218       ○ The Class B uniform will consist of the following:  
219           ▪ Uniform shirt long sleeve or short sleeve or outer vest carrier with undershirt.  
220           ▪ Uniform pants with or without pocket (Cargo Pant)  
221           ▪ Sweater or approved turtleneck/dickie (Optional)

- 222           ▪ Approved black uniform shoes or boots.
- 223           ▪ Stratton hat. (optional)
- 224           ▪ Sheriff's Office Ball cap. (Optional)
- 225           ▪ Knit winter cap. (Optional)
- 226
- 227       • Class C Uniform
- 228           ○ The class C uniform may be worn for the following:
- 229               ▪ Beach duty or other water front events when a class A or B uniform is not
- 230                specified.
- 231               ▪ Extra duty assignments when authorized.
- 232               ▪ Any other Sheriff's Office duty when specifically authorized by a division
- 233                commander or higher.
- 234
- 235           ○ The Class C uniform will consist of the following:
- 236               ▪ Uniform pant with pocket (cargo pant).
- 237               ▪ 5.11 Cargo Short when approved for wear.
- 238               ▪ Department issue Polo shirt with embroidered star on left front.
- 239               ▪ Approved black shoes or boots.
- 240               ▪ Sheriff's Office Ball cap. (optional)
- 241
- 242       • Specialized uniforms
- 243           ○ Specialized uniforms are issued to the following:
- 244               ▪ Honor Guard
- 245               ▪ ERT
- 246               ▪ Bike Patrol
- 247               ▪ DARE
- 248               ▪ Crime Prevention
- 249
- 250           ○ Specialized uniforms may be worn for the following:
- 251               ▪ When authorized by Sheriff and as directed by the commander or supervisor of
- 252                the specialized unit.
- 253
- 254       • Method of wear
- 255           ○ Either the long sleeve shirt or the short sleeve shirt may be worn year around for
- 256            normal duty.
- 257           ○ The long sleeve shirt with tie shall be worn when formal occasions dictate
- 258           ○ During non-formal occasions, a long sleeve shirt may be worn with a tie or a navy or
- 259            black crew neck t-shirt or navy or optional black mock turtleneck
- 260           ○ When wearing a short sleeve shirt, a navy blue or black crew neck T-shirt is required
- 261            for both male and female employees.
- 262           ○ Hats are optional, unless special occasions dictate their use.
- 263           ○ All uniforms worn shall be blue with black basket weave leather gear.
- 264           ○ Uniform shirts and coats shall display the Sheriff's Office patch on each shoulder.
- 265           ○ White uniform shirts will be worn by command staff at the discretion of the Sheriff.
- 266           ○ Name plates shall be worn with the Class A and Class B uniform.

- 267 ○ Name plates shall have at a minimum the deputy's first and middle name initial and  
268 last name.
- 269 ○ Name plates shall be worn centered on the right pocket, aligned with the pocket seam,  
270 approximately ¼ inch below the top of the pocket
- 271 ○ Approved shoes/boots shall be the following style:
- 272     ▪ Patent leather/high gloss style.
- 273     ▪ Leather or synthetic material that can be polished.
- 274     ▪ Boots may have a limited amount of nylon along the tongue and sides along with  
275 minimal rubber toe protection.
- 276
- 277 ○ Sheriff's Office polo shirts are approved for bicycle patrol deputies and other  
278 employees at the discretion of the Sheriff.
- 279 ○ Class C and/or specialized uniforms are approved for specialized personnel (ERT  
280 members, training instructors, DARE officers, crime prevention, etc.) at the discretion  
281 of the Sheriff for special events.
- 282 ○ Uniforms will not be worn or used off duty with the exception of extra duty  
283 assignments for the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office and Court.
- 284 ○ No assigned uniform apparel is to be worn while off duty.
- 285
- 286 ● Uniform and equipment replacement
- 287 ○ When uniform or equipment items are lost, damaged or worn out and are in need of  
288 replacement, deputies shall request replacement or repair in writing to their  
289 supervisor.
- 290 ○ Each supervisor will approve or disapprove the request and forward it to the supply  
291 officer, giving reasons why the items are in need of replacement.
- 292 ○ No replacement will be made without a like item to be turned in unless with approval  
293 from a supervisor if no like item is available to be turned in.
- 294
- 295 ● Severance procedures
- 296 ○ Employees leaving service with the Sheriff's Office through retirement, resignation  
297 or termination shall turn in all issued uniforms and equipment.
- 298 ○ All employees who are severing employment with the Sheriff's Office and who has  
299 been assigned uniforms and equipment will be assigned to the Administrative  
300 Services Division for the last workday for exit processing.
- 301 ○ It shall be the responsibility of the employee's immediate supervisor to ensure that  
302 the employee has accounted for all uniforms and equipment prior to being assigned to  
303 the Administrative Services Division.
- 304 ○ Each employee will turn in his or her issued firearm, ammunition, magazines to the  
305 Sheriff's Office armorer.
- 306 ○ Any employee terminating his or her employment, who fails to turn in all issued  
307 uniforms and equipment, will be subject to legal action to obtain the items in question  
308 or pay the monetary equivalent.
- 309 ○ The Sheriff's Office or York County shall be compensated for lost or damaged  
310 equipment in excess of normal wear.
- 311     ▪ Compensation must be in the form of a money order or a check made payable to  
312 the County of York.

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- Jewelry
  - The following jewelry items may be worn while in uniform:
    - Wristwatches.
    - Watches worn on chains or pinned to the uniform are not permitted.
    - One additional bracelet of a conservative nature other than the watch may be worn on the wrists.
    - Rings shall be limited to a total of three rings on both hands.
    - Neck chains and necklaces, if worn, will not be visible.
    - The wearing of earrings by women is authorized.
      - Women may wear (1) one pair of conservative style earrings with a diameter of no more than ¼”.
      - Hoops or hanging earrings are prohibited.
    - Deputies assigned to narcotics or undercover duties may wear earrings or other grooming styles, as approved by the investigations division commander, at the discretion of the Sheriff.
    - The jewelry and grooming standards contained in this policy shall apply when wearing a Sheriff’s office Uniform.
    - Due to potential safety considerations, arising from deputies engaged in physical confrontation or the constraint of arrestees, body piercing, except as authorized above, and nose rings are prohibited
  
- Tattoos
  - Members shall not appear on duty or in uniform with any visible tattoo that is:
    - Profane
    - Derogatory
    - Suggestive,
    - That displays nudity.
  
  - Extremist tattoos are forbidden.
  - Extremist tattoos are those affiliated with, depicting, or symbolizing:
    - Extremist philosophies, organizations, or activities.
      - ❖ Extremist philosophies, organizations, and activities are those that advocate racial, gender, or ethnic hatred or intolerance, advocate, create, or engage in illegal discrimination based on race, color, gender, ethnicity, religion, or national origin.
  
  - Branding or scarification marks must be covered while on duty or in uniform.
  - No tattoos shall be visible on, above the neck, or below the wrists.
  - When judging the appropriateness of tattoos, the opinion will be more conservative than liberal.
  - Tattoos that do not meet the criteria above must be covered while on duty or in uniform.
  - Deputies wishing to appear in uniform with visible tattoos should approach a supervisor for approval.

- 359           ○ When questionable tattoos exist, the decisions on the appropriateness of the tattoo  
360           will be made by the command staff with guidance and approval from the Sheriff.  
361
- 362       ● Grooming Standards
  - 363           ○ Male
  - 364               ▪ Hair shall be kept neat and clean.
  - 365               ▪ Hair on the back of the head shall not extend below the top of the shirt collar.
  - 366               ▪ Hair shall not cover any portion of the outside of the ear.
  - 367               ▪ Hair shall not be worn in any eccentric style such as, but not limited to:
  - 368                   ❖ Afro exceeding two inches.
  - 369                   ❖ Mohawk.
  - 370                   ❖ Knitting of the hair.
  - 371                   ❖ Exotic design or row cutting.
  - 372                   ❖ Eccentric or exotic coloring.
  - 373
  - 374               ▪ Personnel are expected to be clean-shaven, other than the exceptions listed below:
  - 375                   ❖ Mustaches and Van Dyke beards are allowed but must comply with all of the
  - 376                   parameters established in this section.
  - 377                   ❖ Facial hair should be conservative and in a style that would be acceptable in a
  - 378                   business environment.
  - 379                   ❖ Facial Hair will be kept neatly groomed to no longer than 1 inch in
  - 380                   length.
  - 381                   ❖ Facial hair must not interfere with the ability of the breathing
  - 382                   apparatus to seal.
  - 383
  - 384               ▪ Personnel shall notify their supervisor of intent to grow facial hair and are
  - 385               encouraged to start the growth of mustaches or goatees during extended
  - 386               days off in an effort to minimize poor appearance.
  - 387               ▪ Changing between clean-shaven and growing facial hair shall be kept to a
  - 388               minimum.
  - 389               ▪ Growing of facial hair as a means of not shaving will not be tolerated.
  - 390               ▪ Sideburns shall not extend below the bottom of the earlobe and shall be of
  - 391               an even width.
  - 392               ▪ The bottom of the sideburn shall be trimmed with a clean shaved
  - 393               horizontal line.
  - 394               ▪ Mustaches shall be groomed.
  - 395
  - 396       ● Grooming Standards
  - 397           ○ Female
  - 398               ▪ Hair shall be kept neat and clean.
  - 399               ▪ Hair shall not be styled in any fashion that hinders wearing of the uniform
  - 400               hat in the prescribed manner, when required.
  - 401               ▪ No decorations shall be worn in the hair except clips or pins that closely
  - 402               match the hair color, or are conservative and modest in nature.

- 403           ▪ Hair shall not be worn in any eccentric style such as, but not limited to:
- 404           ❖ Afro exceeding two inches.
- 405           ❖ Mohawk.
- 406           ❖ Knitting of the hair.
- 407           ❖ Exotic design or row cutting.
- 408           ❖ Eccentric or exotic coloring.
- 409
- 410           ▪ False eyelashes, which are exaggerated or readily identifiable, shall not be
- 411           permitted or worn.
- 412           ▪ Cosmetics shall be subdued and match the natural color of the skin.
- 413           ▪ Fingernails shall be kept clean and neatly trimmed and shall not extend
- 414           beyond the tips of the fingers or thumbs.
- 415           ▪ Fingernails may be polished with a conservative color.
- 416           ▪ Female staff shall wear a brassiere.
- 417
- 418       • Court attire
- 419           ○ On duty personnel.
- 420           ▪ If on-duty, uniform patrol deputies will appear for court in an approved
- 421           Class A or B uniform.
- 422
- 423           ○ Off Duty personnel.
- 424           ▪ If off duty or if working in a special status and authorized to wear civilian
- 425           clothing, employees shall wear either the approved uniform or appear
- 426           suitably dressed in civilian business attire.
- 427           ▪ Appropriate civilian business attire shall be:
- 428           ❖ For men, civilian business attire is defined as tie, dress shirt,
- 429           dress/semi-dress trousers and sport coat or men's suit.
- 430           ❖ For women, civilian business attire is defined as a dress; combination
- 431           of skirt, blouse, and blazer; business suit or pants suit.
- 432
- 433           ▪ Personnel assigned to the Investigations Division will appear for court in
- 434           civilian business attire.
- 435           ▪ Personnel immediately called to court without prior notification may
- 436           appear in a manner of dress less than specified above, after making
- 437           notification to their supervisor.

439       **Ribbons, Medals, Service Stripes, and Mourning Bands**

- 440
- 441       • The following list of ribbons may be awarded by the Sheriff for varying degrees
- 442       of meritorious service.
- 443       ○ The hierarchy of ribbons is as follows:
- 444           ▪ **Patriot Ribbon** (Requirements)
- 445           ❖ Employed by the YPSO on 9/11/2001 and on duty.
- 446           ➤ Ribbon with bronze oak leaf.
- 447           ❖ Employed by the YPSO on 9/11/2001.
- 448

- 449                   ➤ Ribbon with bronze star.
- 450
- 451           ❖ Employed by the YPSO for 1 year.
- 452                   ➤ Ribbon only.
- 453
- 454           ▪ **Medal of Honor Ribbon – Posthumously (Requirements)**
- 455                   ❖ This award will be given to the family of a deceased deputy for the
- 456                   loss of life while in the line of duty and who:
- 457                           ➤ Displayed outstanding heroism in the line of duty;
- 458                           ➤ At great personal risk and with the full knowledge of risk;
- 459                           ➤ In the highest tradition of law enforcement.
- 460
- 461                   ❖ All of the above criteria listed must be met.
- 462                   ❖ The Sheriff will personally present this honor to the family.
- 463
- 464           ▪ **Medal of Honor Ribbon (Requirements)**
- 465                   ❖ This award is presented to a deputy who distinguishes him or herself
- 466                   by:
- 467                           ➤ Gallantry and action, above and beyond the call of duty, while
- 468                           serving as a deputy in the Sheriff’s Office and displays:
- 469                           ➤ Outstanding heroism in the line of duty;
- 470                           ➤ Action(s) beyond the call of duty;
- 471                           ➤ With the full knowledge of risk;
- 472                           ➤ The deputy must have displayed unselfish commitment to law
- 473                           enforcement and to the life of another, with great personal risk to
- 474                           his or her own life, or by sustaining serious injury.
- 475
- 476                   ❖ This award is given at the discretion of the Sheriff and will be worn
- 477                   immediately below the deputy’s badge.
- 478
- 479           ▪ **Purple Heart Ribbon (Requirements)**
- 480                   ❖ This award is presented to a deputy who sustains serious injury in the
- 481                   line of duty, while actively engaged in a law enforcement action,
- 482                   resulting from:
- 483                           ➤ An assault,
- 484                           ➤ Fire,
- 485                           ➤ Explosion, or
- 486                           ➤ Other law enforcement related action while meeting the following
- 487                   criteria:
- 488                           ✓ The deputy must have been actively engaged in a law enforcement
- 489                           action, in the line of duty.
- 490                           ✓ The deputy must sustain serious injury, from assault, fire
- 491                           explosion, or other law enforcement related action.
- 492                           ✓ The deputy exercised all responsible safety precautions possible
- 493                           ✓ And the deputy’s actions were consistent with Sheriff’s Office
- 494                           policies and procedures.

- 495 ✓ The Purple Heart will not be awarded for injuries sustained in  
496 ✓ Training accidents.  
497 ✓ Motor vehicle accidents except in case where clear evidence  
498 indicates that the deputy exercised all responsible safety  
499 precautions and had no reasonable control over the circumstances,  
500 and the deputy's actions were consistent with Sheriff's Office  
501 policies and/or procedures.  
502
- 503 ■ **Combat Cross Ribbon (Requirements)**  
504 ❖ This award is presented to a deputy who, during the course of their  
505 duties, was actively engaged in a law enforcement related combat  
506 action when:  
507 ➤ The perpetrator would have actually applied a dangerous weapon  
508 toward or at the deputy, or another person with the intent to  
509 seriously injure or kill the deputy or other person and,  
510 ➤ The deputy must have met this threat with deadly force.  
511 ✓ The mere pointing of a firearm, knife or other weapon toward a  
512 deputy does not constitute combat.  
513
- 514 ❖ The deputy must have been involved in combat with an armed  
515 adversary during the course of the deputy's duties with a suspect who  
516 by their actions posed a serious threat of death or serious injury to the  
517 deputy or others by applying the weapon at or toward the deputy.  
518 ➤ The mere pointing of a firearm, knife or other weapon is  
519 insufficient for combat requirement  
520
- 521 ■ **Life Saving Ribbon (Requirements)**  
522 ❖ This award is presented to a deputy for:

534 ➤ Successful deployment and administration of the AED, or  
535 ➤ Successful administration of NARCAN.  
536
- 537 ■ **Sheriff's Special Commendation Ribbon (Requirements)**  
538 ❖ This award is presented to any Sheriff's Office employee who exhibits  
539 outstanding performance of duty under unusual or difficult conditions.

- 540 ❖ The action need not involve exposure to physical danger, but must  
541 involve:  
542 ❖ Unusual thoroughness or conscientiousness, determination and  
543 initiative or,  
544 ❖ Consists of a meritorious action of a nature which would not be  
545 eligible for a higher award or,  
546 ❖ By the employee's continuing performance and display of devotion to  
547 the Sheriff's Office and the County of York.  
548 ❖ Outstanding performance of duty under unusual or difficult conditions.  
549 ❖ A letter of commendation from the Sheriff does not suffice for this  
550 award  
551
- 552 ■ **Deputy of the Year Ribbon (Requirements)**
    - 553 ❖ This award is presented to any deputy who has been recognized for his  
554 or her level of service, commitment, dedication, integrity, or who acted  
555 as a standard for other employees to follow and who brings acclaim to  
556 the York Poquoson Sheriff's Office.

558 civic or community groups who routinely present a Deputy of the Year

562 commitment, dedication and integrity, and
      - 563 ➤ By doing so, sets a standard for other employees to follow and  
564 brings acclaim to the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office.
      - 565 ➤ Must be selected by the YPSO, County, a civic group, or  
566 community group as Deputy of the Year.

  - 584 ■ **Career Ladder Ribbon (Requirements)**

- 585 ❖ The award is presented to deputies who meet the requirements under  
586 Policy [RR 1-12A, Deputy Sheriff Career Ladder Program](#) and:  
587 ➤ Achieve the status of Deputy First Class.  
588 ✓ Career ladder ribbon only.  
589  
590 ➤ Achieve the status of Master Deputy.  
591 ✓ Career ladder ribbon with oak leaf cluster.  
592
- 593 ■ **Education Achievement Ribbon (Requirements)**  
594 ❖ This award is presented to an employee of the York-Poquoson  
595 Sheriff's Office who consistently strives for educational achievement  
596 and has enhanced the level of service rendered to this office and  
597 public, through the benefit of their education and training and:  
598 ➤ Earned at least an Associate's Degree in the Criminal Justice field  
599 from an accredited college or university.  
600 ✓ Educational achievement ribbon only.  
601  
602 ➤ Earned a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited college or  
603 university  
604 ✓ Educational achievement ribbon with 1 star.  
605  
606 ➤ Earned a Master's Degree from an accredited college or university.  
607 ✓ Educational achievement ribbon with 2 stars.  
608  
609 ➤ Earned a PhD from an accredited college or university.  
610 ✓ Educational achievement ribbon with 3 stars.

- 612 ■ **FBI National Academy Ribbon (Requirements)**  
613 ❖ This ribbon is presented to deputies who have:  
614 ✓ Successfully completed the FBI National Academy.

- 616 ■ **Forensic Science Academy Graduate Ribbon (Requirements)**  
617 ❖ This ribbon is presented to deputies who have:  
618 ✓ Successfully completed the Virginia Forensic Science Academy.  
619
- 620 ■ **Pistol Achievement Ribbon and Medal (Requirements)**  
621 ❖ This ribbon and pin is awarded to deputies who achieve the qualifying  
622 scores with their issued duty weapon (Pistol).  
623 ❖ This ribbon or medal may be worn during the year following the  
624 qualifying score.  
625 ❖ Deputies achieving a qualifying score three consecutive years are  
626 permanently awarded the associated ribbon and medal unless a higher  
627 qualifying score is achieved.  
628 ❖ Deputies awarded a ribbon or pin for a higher qualifying score, after  
629 receiving a permanent award may wear the ribbon or medal associated

- 630 with the higher qualifying score for the year following the  
 631 achievement.
- 632 ❖ If a deputy fails to maintain the higher qualifying score in either of the  
 633 two years following the higher award, they shall revert back to the  
 634 previously awarded permanent ribbon or medal.
  - 635 ❖ Deputies who achieve the higher qualifying score 3 consecutive shall  
 636 be awarded the higher ribbon and medal for permanent wear.

  - 666 ❖ A deputy must obtain or previously obtained DARE America  
 667 certification as a DARE Mentor.
  - 668
  - 669 ■ **Field Training Officer Ribbon (Requirements)**
  - 670 ❖ To be awarded this ribbon a deputy must:  
 671 ➤ Be a current agency approved FTO.  
 672 ✓ FTO ribbon and collar brass.
  - 673
  - 674 ➤ Be a former YPSO approved FTO.  
 675 ✓ FTO ribbon only.

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- ❖ Completion of the DCJS FTO course does not qualify a deputy for this ribbon. To qualify for this ribbon, the deputy must be or have been a Sheriff's Office approved FTO.

    - Obtain and maintain an instructor certification from DCJS, other governing body or manufacturer instructor certification as a:
      - ✓ General Instructor
      - ✓ Firearms Instructor
      - ✓ Driving Instructor
      - ✓ Defensive Tactics Instructor
      - ✓ RADAR/LIDAR Instructor
      - ✓ SFST Instructor

- 796                   ○ The following medals are authorized for wear in lieu of the full complement
- 797                   of ribbons listed above on class A and class B uniforms.
- 798                   ▪ **Weapons Qualification medal**
- 799                   ❖ A pistol weapons qualification medal may be worn consistent with the
- 800                   awarded Weapons Qualification ribbon.
- 801                   ➤ The pistol weapons qualification medal shall be worn no more than
- 802                   ¼” above and centered along the top of the right breast pocket.

- 804                   ▪ **Patriot Medal**
- 805                   ❖ A Patriot medal may be worn consistent with the awarded Patriot

823 ➤ The Sheriff's Special Commendation medal shall be worn centered  
824 on the left breast pocket flap with the top of the medal along the  
825 upper seam of the pocket flap.  
826 ➤ Deputies who have earned both the Combat Cross and the Sheriff's  
827 Special Commendation ribbon may wear both medals side by side  
828 centered on the left breast pocket flap with the top of the medals  
829 along the upper seam of the pocket flap. The two medals shall be  
830 worn, when looking at the pocket flap, left to right with the  
831 Combat Cross then the Sheriff's Special Commendation medal.

- 833 ■ **Military Service Pin**  
834 ❖ Deputies who have earned the Military Veteran ribbon may also wear

841 ❖ The Military Service pin shall be worn on the right breast pocket flap  
842 centered between the left edge of the name tag and left edge if the  
843 pockets flap.  
844 ❖ The Military Service pin will denote the following:  
845 ❖ Branch of Service.

- 847 ■ The deputy receiving the Military Service pin may request the following  
848 denoted on the pin:  
849 ❖ Branch of Service only, or  
850 ❖ Branch of Service and Veteran, or  
851 ❖ Branch of Service and Retired.

- 853 ● Wearing of ribbons  
854 ○ There is a [Ribbon Chart](#) in the Forms folder in PowerDMS that displays the  
855 hierarchy and an image of each ribbon  
856 ○ The precedence of wear shall be the order the medal requirements are listed  
857 above.  
858 ○ Ribbons shall be worn left to right, top to bottom in hierachy.

- 859           ○ The Patriot Ribbon shall be worn as the highest precedent ribbon on the top  
860 left side, since it represents the flag of the United States of America.  
861           ○ Ribbons shall only be worn during special occasions and only with the Class  
862 “A” Uniform.  
863
- 864       ● Authorization to wear ribbons
    - 865           ○ Only the ribbons and appliances approved in this directive shall be worn while  
866 in uniform  
867
    - 868           ○ **Years of service stripes**
      - 869               ■ Years of Service stipes are presented to employees of the York-Poquoson  
870 Sheriff’s Office for years of commitment, dedication, and service with the  
871 York-Poquoson Sheriff’s Office and are awarded as follows:
        - 872                   ❖ Sworn employee (career or auxiliary) with the York-Poquoson  
873 Sheriff’s Office, and
        - 874                   ❖ Served continuously for five years or more.
          - 875                       ➤ One stripe will be awarded for each five (5) years of service  
876
        - 877                   ❖ Years of Service stripes will be worn on the outside of the lower left  
878 sleeve only on long sleeve shirts and dress coats.  
879
    - 880           ○ **Black Mourning Bands**
      - 881               ■ Black mourning bands worn over badges are to show respect for fallen law  
882 enforcement officers who die in the line of duty.
      - 883               ■ Mourning Bands will only be worn at the direction of the Sheriff or his  
884 designee.
      - 885               ■ Mourning bands may either be:
        - 886                   ❖ Solid black, or
        - 887                   ❖ Black with thin blue line.
