



CBH Mission



Opioid Crisis

- National attention has gotten local
- No community not affected
- CBH has seen a 72% increase in positive drug screens for opioids in the past 18 months
- Increased needs identified also by law enforcement, Social Services, etc.

CBH Response - Opioids

1. Suboxone Clinic
2. REVIVE! Training
3. Use of Narcan (Naloxone)



Suboxone Clinic

- Set to open Fall 2017
- For adults 18+
- Both detox and maintenance protocols, but detox is preferable
- Medication regimen will require active treatment as well (outpatient, IOP, Peer Support, care coordination, etc.)
- High cost of service requires reimbursement

REVIVE! Training

- REVIVE! is the Opioid Overdose and Naloxone Education (OONE) program for the Commonwealth of Virginia. REVIVE! provides training to professionals, stakeholders, and others on how to recognize and respond to an opioid overdose emergency with the administration of naloxone (Narcan[®]).
- CBH staff are receiving this training.

Narcan[®] (Naloxone)

- Medication delivered to immediately reverse the toxic effects of an opioid overdose
- Similar in administration concept to an Epi-Pen for severe allergies (but works differently)
- 2016 data shows over 26,000 lives saved in U.S. already by effective administration of this medication

Legislative Priorities

1. Resolution of new unfunded mandates created by 2017 General Assembly Action
 - a. Adds 2 new mandates by FY 2019 (1 funded at CBH to date)
 - b. Adds several more by FY 2022 (total cost to system of \$200M+; CBH cost would be \$3.5M+)
 - c. Only \$4.9M funded statewide to date
2. Advocacy for tract of land at ESH to consolidate Williamsburg-area services

Legislative Priorities

3. Response to anticipated state plan to align CSB and state hospital finances
 - a. Requirement for plan created by General Assembly via budget language
 - b. Plan due to GA by 12/1/17
 - c. Plan likely to require CSBs to purchase some number of state hospital bed days
 - d. Not sure funding or safeguards will be adequate
 - e. Need to watch this for risks to CSB an local govt.

Facility Issues

1. Williamsburg area locations
 - a. Overcrowding and inadequate parking
 - b. Seek to consolidate locations with eye toward future service development and growth
2. York-Poquoson office
 - a. Overcrowded
 - b. Seek new location with eye toward future service development and growth

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
