### Overnight Road Work On Portion of Victory Boulevard Begins Soon

Contractor crews with VDOT will be performing work that requires the closure of portions of Victory Boulevard (Route 171) between Big Bethel Road and Route 134 next week (11/14-15). Road closures will be from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. and will require drivers to follow detours around the area. This field work will evaluate pavement and soil conditions as part of the development of preliminary plans for future improvements. All work is dependent on weather conditions.
